### What does your dollar buy?



Physical therapy provides a way for children to work on their balance, coordination, strength and endurance. Children recovering from severe burns and car accidents, as well as children with disabilities like Spina bifida and Cerebral Palsy, can increase their independence and the health of their muscles and bones with ongoing therapy.

**\$100 will provide one week of Physical Therapy for a child.**

Speech therapy helps children with hearing loss as well as children with developmental delays and other disabilities. Children learn how to better communicate through using words, sign language, hearing aids and other adaptive equipment.

**\$150 will provide one week of Speech Therapy for a child.**



Occupational therapy helps children with disabilities to learn everyday life skills that many of us take for granted. Whether they are learning to button a button, hold a crayon or feed themselves, occupational therapy helps children with a variety of disabilities, from Autism to Williams syndrome, become more independent and improve their quality of life.

**\$200 will provide two weeks of Occupational Therapy for a child.**

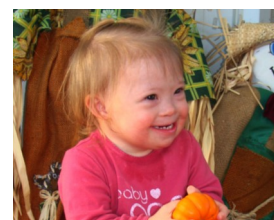
Our nurses provide the care needed so that medically fragile children may attend preschool. From peanut allergies to feeding tubes, they are available to assist all children on site each day.

**\$250 provides Nursing Services for one day.**



Early intervention makes a life changing difference in the future of children with special needs.

**\$525 will send a special needs child to school five full days a week for one month.**



***Want to impact even more lives?*** Music therapy reaches as many as 170 children a year at Challenged Child and Friends. Music opens doors long closed to children with disabilities. We have seen children with Autism and Downs syndrome who are not talking begin to sing.  
**\$7000 will provide a year of Music Therapy once a week for every child (including our infants) in our morning intervention program.**
